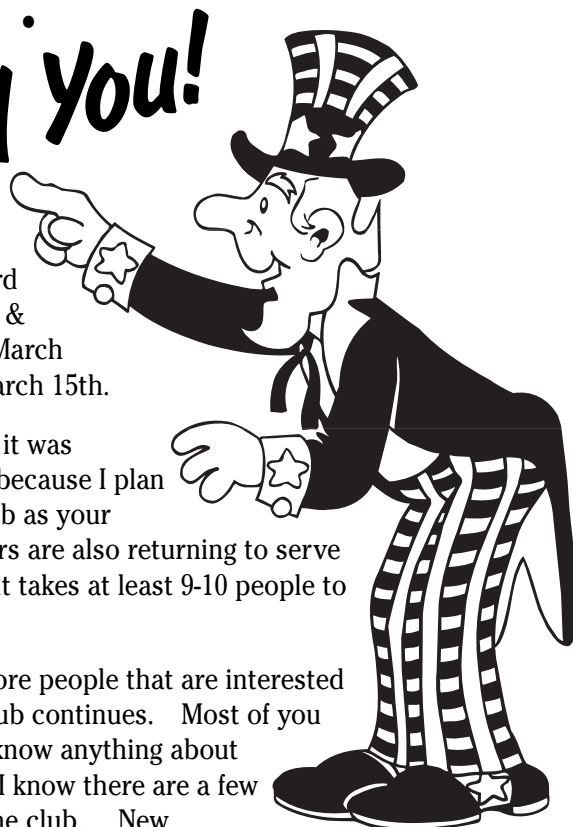

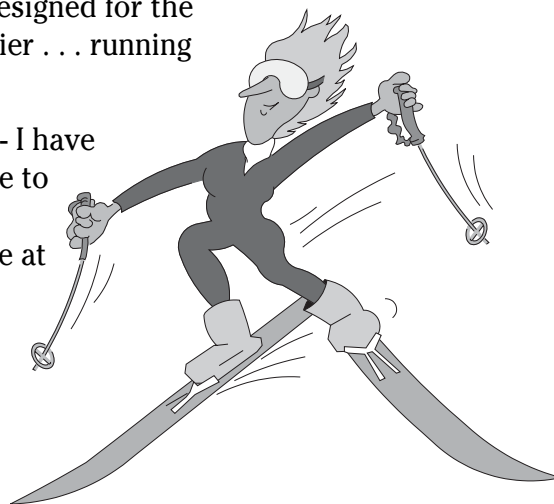
February General Meeting:

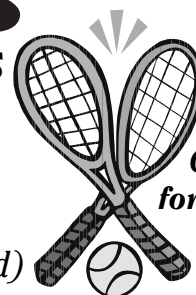

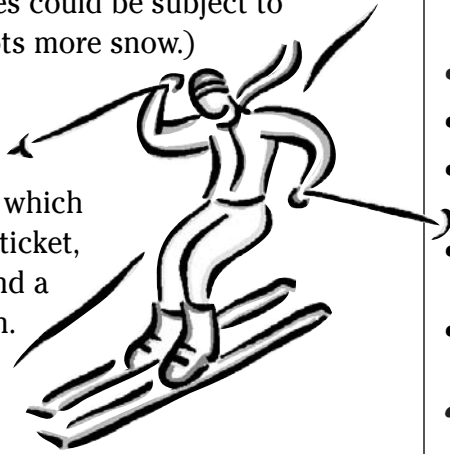

Trip Talk....

What's New....

....As I write this column, our rescheduled trip to Brianhead will be leaving this weekend and our trip participants will be greeted with a fresh batch of new snow. Your trip leaders are focused on making sure you have the best experience possible on your distant trips, including optimal snow conditions. Sometimes we have little control over the weather, but we certainly try to run your trips for the best possible conditions given the history of the area. Not only is Brianhead full, but Cyndy's trip to Lake Tahoe leaving at the end of the January is over capacity. I just got back from Tahoe and the skiing conditions are excellent there. We will look forward to both post-trip reports in our next newsletter.

....Based on information received at our general membership meeting in January, the Summit County/Vail trip is technically full, but we can still accommodate one more person pending additional air. The Whistler trip is also at capacity and participants will enjoy some of the finest snow Whistler has ever had this year. Gary tells me he has two seats left on Telluride, so anyone wanting to go to Colorado this season needs to call your respective trip captain now. Mammoth, which is going in April, is starting to fill, so let Peggy know if you want ski Mammoth this year...the snow there is also excellent, especially late in the season.

Non-Ski Distant Trips....

Your Board has approved two additional non-ski trips for the coming season, with a third trip being finalized as of this writing:

....Taking place over the 4th of July weekend, LVSSC will be going to Napa Valley to learn about and experience first-hand the nuances of wine-making. This Premier Wine Tasting Tour will visit 12 of the finest wineries in the Napa Valley area with all ground transportation via private motor coach and private group tastings at each winery. Combine air to Oakland, deluxe accommodations at the River Terrace Inn, a group dinner, shopping, and fine dining and you have all the ingredients

for a great holiday weekend away from the summer heat. If anyone would like to captain this trip, please contact me at 602.821.4987.

....Last year, we did a unique trip which combined horseback riding with Lake Havasu. This year, we promise another unique combination of activities during the third weekend in August. Join your friends for a nice cool weekend in the Sierra Nevada's during our Truckee River Rafting Tour. After flying into Reno, you will enjoy deluxe accommodations in two-bedroom, two-bath condominiums in the Village at Squaw Valley. The fun starts with an eco-adventure hike on Saturday and after lunch, we will raft the Truckee River followed by a group dinner in the Village. On Sunday, we will enjoy a mountain biking clinic followed by lunch and shopping in Truckee and an afternoon kayak tour down the Truckee River into Reno. Don't worry if you feel you aren't athletic or proficient enough for these activities, since the tour company knows we will have some beginners. Experienced hikers, riders, and rafters will also be afforded a more spirited activity level depending upon individual experience.

....We are now almost half full on the Lake Powell Houseboat trip for Labor Day, 2006. We have 10 people signed up and deposited and can only take 24 due to the maximum boat capacities. If you are thinking about going to Lake Powell, I would suggest sending in a nominal \$50 deposit to the ski club PO Box to ensure

you will be able to go, or at least give Dave or myself a call to express your interest. This one will fill early and cannot be expanded. Lake Powell is a once-in-a-lifetime, must-do activity and this will be a fun way to enjoy nature at its best. The Phoenix Ski Club will also be on the Lake at the same time and will try and join them for a joint party.

....The arrangements are coming together nicely for the Canyon De Chelley/Monument Valley/Grand Canyon Excursion scheduled for May, 2006. Because of increased fuel costs, charter buses are coming in a bit higher than forecasted, which may slightly increase targeted pricing, but we are trying to improve on the hotel costs to partially compensate. If anyone would like to captain any of these non-ski distant trips, please let me know.

....We are always interested in your suggestions and involvement in developing our distant trip schedule. 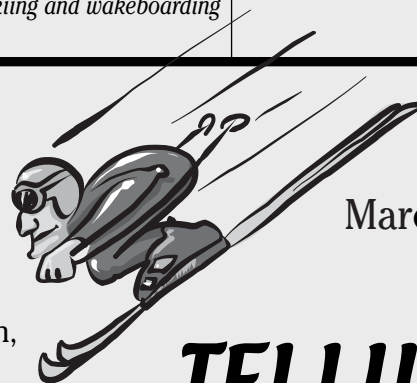
