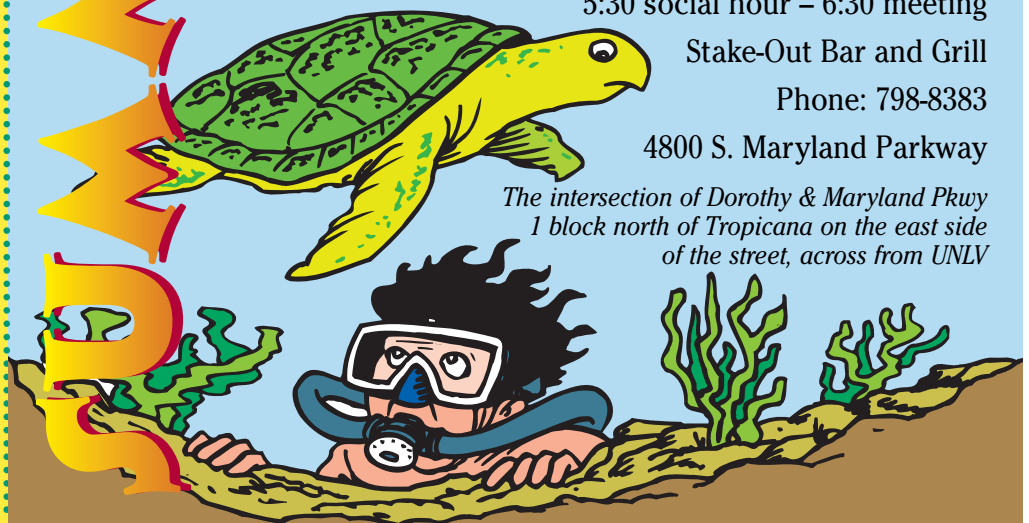

# Director's Column

## Ski Trips — It's all about Planning

Barely put away the skis and fleece for the season when it's already time to plan for next season's schedule of ski trips for the LVSSC. The Trip Committee has already met twice to arrange the calendar for distant ski trip locations. Think we're jumping the gun? Ski Industry wholesalers typically start writing proposals early as spring for the next season. Resorts often give discounts for lifts tickets when they are booked more than 10 months in advance. As club trip leaders we are hard at work acquiring those early season discounts to pass on to our club members. Our mission is to arrange the ski season with great trips that meet the member's needs and desires.

Ever plan a family trip? Aunt Betty likes condos so she can cook during her stay. Uncle Herb likes hotels so he doesn't have to eat Aunt Betty cooking. Cousin Billy could care less about dining and shopping for more t-shirts, for him it's all about the skiing and nightlife. Cousin Brittany skis ½ days then is in need of a spa treatment. Think of the club as a big family and your trying to please everyone. Catch my drift?

Careful consideration goes into choosing a ski resort destination. Is the area suitable for all levels of skiers? Weather and conditions for that time of ski season? Enough après activities to make the resort appealing and of course PRICE.

Several components go into a ski trip package. Transportation issues must be addressed. Are group air seats available? Most large airlines will hold a certain amount of seats for "bulk air". That means they are reserved for our club till 60 days prior to departure, without having to give names for ticketing. These are not always the cheapest seats on the plane. Many times internet fares are less expensive but airlines will NOT delay ticketing for internet specials. Then ground transfers options must be calculated and reserved.

Next, deciding on lodging properties. Hotels vs. condos. The great debate! Some people love the "group experience" of condo sharing. The ease of having your own kitchen for meals and the camaraderie of roommates is appealing for some. Other members are late sleepers and prefer not to be wakened by the first trackers, so they

opt for hotels. Most ski resort condos are privately owned, bed configurations can be a big headache. Does the property have enough single beds to accommodate both couples and singles? Do the lodging properties offer a safe cancellation policy? Unfortunately trip leaders cannot look into a crystal ball in June and determine how many members will sign up for this trip. Can we turn back any condos or hotel rooms without risking a financial penalty for turning back any unused condos is a big concern.

You can be assured we are looking at all possibilities for saving you the club member's money and at the same time not taking any financial risk for the club. We also take into consideration that the cheapest trip on a proposal is not necessary the best value for your money! So when you look at our very exciting trip options for the 07-08 ski season, feel confident we have put forth our best efforts!

Yes, its true ski vacation costs have gone up! It's hard not to compare prices from that trip that you did 8 years ago to a certain resort and expect prices to run a parallel. We would all love to pay the same gas, real estate and utility prices we did a few years ago. Unfortunately the travel and ski industry is not immune to rate hikes. Luckily we have the power of group bookings and discounts to offset costs. Our club trips save as much as 25% of the total cost if you were to book individually. As well as the advantages such as: matching you with roommates to share lodging costs, flexible payment and deposit schedules, (Prestige Travel won't call to remind you that final payment was due a week ago) and the whole group fun aspect! All you have to do is show up and have fun! We take very seriously the task of getting the most bang for your vacation dollar! So when you take a look at the great selection of ski trips this year, rest assured we have gone to great lengths to give to you the members a great variety and great value in these selections!

So sign up early and get those deposits, you don't want to be left out on the waiting list this year!

# Do You Have a US Passport Yet?

It is becoming more and more important for our Las Vegas Ski & Sports Club members to have a passport so, I thought I would write about the process in this newsletter. My wife Orena and I are currently filling out our applications and will be starting the process ourselves very soon.

- Since January 2007, anyone traveling **by air** outside of the U.S. and our territories must present a valid U.S. passport.
- By January 2008, this requirement will extend to **land travel** as well.

Great information regarding passports can be obtained through the Department of State website at [www.travel.state.gov](http://www.travel.state.gov). NOTE: According to an AP report in mid-March, the increased demand for U.S. passports has resulted in a backlog of passport applications. Despite working overtime to overcome the problem, applicants are typically experiencing a wait of as long as ten weeks. So allow yourself some time and get started on it now.

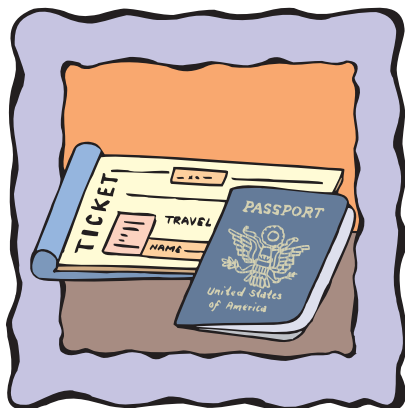
## What you will need:

U.S. Passport Applications are available through many U.S. Post Offices and county recorder offices. Stop by your local PO or call them to see what times they accept passport applications. Your US passport is generally the only document which proves two things: your citizenship and your identity. Therefore, you will need to prove your identity, citizenship, furnish 2 photo's and pay fees with your passport application.

1. **Identity:** You will need to provide proof of your identity through a government issued photo ID (generally a driver's license).
2. **Citizenship:** Proof of your citizenship can be proven through a certified copy of your birth certificate if born in the U.S., or a Naturalization Certificate issued by INS or USCIS. If you do not have one, it takes two to four weeks to get a copy of your birth certificate from a state agency. Of course, there is a cost of \$15 - \$20 involved.
3. **Color Photographs:** You will need two 2" x 2" photos of yourself; the exact specifications are outlined on the application form. Some local pharmacy's offer a passport photo service for \$7.99.
4. **Fees:** The current cost for a passport for someone over age 16 is \$97. You can request expeditious processing for your passport for an additional \$60.

A passport is not cheap, and the standard process is not quick. But this valuable document is a necessity to travel. You wouldn't want to miss a great opportunity because you failed to obtain a passport should your club head to Canada or Mexico, or who knows where.

- Groceries/Camping Supplies: Supplies can be purchased at the General Store adjacent to the North Rim Campground

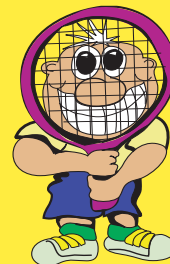

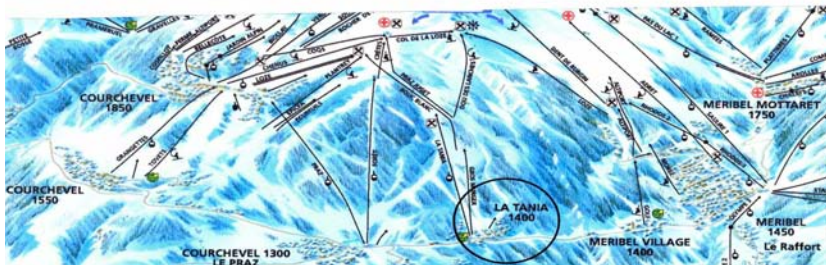

*This trail is the most popular trail in Mt Charleston. A short hike utilizing switchbacks (12) and stone steps on a very well marked and heavily used trail. There is a nice size cave along the N cliff, to the left of the falls on the left, with an easy to follow path leading to the mouth of the cave. From the base of the falls you can see Big Falls to the West, and Charleston Peak in the background. This is a pretty trail with ponderosa pines, white fir, aspen, and mountain mahogany. Look for deer and fox in the aspens at sunrise and sunset, near the beginning /end of trail. Hike early to avoid the crowds at Mary Jane Falls.*
